


Seventeenth Sunday in Ordinary Time July 26, 2015

"SINCE JESUS KNEW THAT THEY WERE GOING TO COME AND CARRY HIM OFF TO MAKE HIM KING, HE WITHDREW AGAIN TO THE MOUNTAIN ALONE." (John 6:1-15). They would make Him King—what's wrong with that? It would be rather great, right? The long awaited Messiah is here to reestablish David's kingdom, with prosperity, and independence, - the good life the Jewish people were awaiting for many centuries. But, surprisingly, Jesus disappears, He hides in the mountains. He doesn't want them to make him king. Why? Because His kingdom is not of this world. His astonishing miracle, the feeding of a large crowd by the multiplication of a few loaves of bread and and two fish was not mainly to satisfy their earthly hunger, that was secondary, - His principal message was on a higher level: the earthly food, necessary it may may be for earthly life, is not the most important nourishment for man. Man is created for a higher destiny, eternal life, so, he needs divine nourishment, "food from heaven." Christ, Himself is that food - the Holy Eucharist, by which sin and death is destroyed, and authentic liberty is brought to mankind. The true Messiah has nothing to do with the conquering, victorious earthly ruler, the political "liberator" imagined by the majority of the people. He is the "Suffering Servant" of the Scriptures, who conquers the world by dying on the cross. This is, no doubt, "a hard teaching."- as the disciples themselves said. Itt is hard for us, too, men of our times. The way of the cross - the Christian way is, indeed, a hard way. It needs heroes to walk it. That's why there are so few true Christians in the world. Pray to God that you may be one of them.


